



MSP's Top Tips for applying for farm work in Tasmania:

- Ensure you have everything you need to complete your registration including:
 - Personal details, email address and phone number
 - Tax File Number
 - **Bank Account Details**
 - Job Active Provider details
 - Superannuation provider and account details
- If you have specific skills or experience such us previous farm or picking work as well as special licences such as forklift or truck license, ensure you have a resume and attach it with your application
- Apply with multiple labour hire companies and recruitment agencies to increase your chances
- Transport try to get your license, or team up with someone else who does and travel together. Provide the name of the person you will be travelling with to the agency when you apply.
- Check your emails and phone messages regularly and respond quickly to job offers

The following agencies and labour hire companies will assist to match you with employment positions in the agricultural industry that are suited to your location, experience and interest. Each company works slightly differently so to increase your chances of securing work ensure you complete all relevant registrations and inductions and respond promptly when you are contacted.

Agri Labour Australia.

A Tasmanian farm work recruitment specialist. You can apply for a variety of agricultural jobs and seasonal work through Agri Labour.

What happens next:

- You will be matched with a farm based on the information you provided in your expression of interest form.
- Once Harvest Trail has matched you with an employer they will invite you to a session to complete your registration and induction.
- To complete your registration you will need
 - Photo ID (driver's license, immicard etc)
 - Copy of visa if you are a temporary visa holder
 - Centrelink Card if you are on payments
 - Medicare card/student card/bank card etc to make up 100 points of ID
