

Shared responsibilities for keeping children safe



CatholicCare Tasmania workers will:

- Do our best to make sure that you are safe from harm;
- Ensure your parent/carer introduces you to the staff member who will be seeing you and remains on-site while you are at CatholicCare;
- Supervise you while you are at CatholicCare Tasmania;
- Ask your parent/carers permission in writing before we:
 - o Take you on an excursion
 - Arrange overnight stays or camps;
 - o Provide transport to you.
- Ask your parent/ guardian if it is OK to take pictures of you;
- Not babysit you, visit your home or give you gifts;
- Not call, text email, or message you or make contact with you through social media or online games;
- Give you guidance that is fair, respectful and appropriate to your age and background; and
- Help you and other children if you feel unsafe, uncomfortable or upset.

What you can do to help us keep you and other children and young people safe

When you take part in a CatholicCare Tasmania activity, event or program you can help us keep you and other children safe by:

- Telling a worker or parent if you feel unsafe, upset or uncomfortable;
- Being welcoming to all children and others you might be doing the activities with;
- Following the rules we all agree to for the activity, event or program;
- Listening to others and being kind;
- Asking staff if you need to leave the activity;
